

Dear Visitors to Court Hearings,

We kindly ask you to observe the following rules of conduct while attending proceedings at the High Anti-Corruption Court.

Persons present in the courtroom are required to:

- Stand when the judges enter and leave the courtroom;
- Remain standing while the court decision is being announced;
- Maintain silence at all times;
- Comply with the instructions of the presiding judge;
- Observe the established order and decorum of the court proceedings;
- Refrain from any actions that demonstrate disrespect towards the court or violate courtroom rules.

We strongly request that you refrain from the following:

- Do not argue with judges, court ushers, or other court staff;
- Do not use mobile phones during the hearing (please ensure that all devices are set to silent mode);
- Do not consume food or beverages, and do not chew gum in the courtroom;
- Do not discuss the course of the proceedings with other attendees during the hearing (please maintain silence);
- Do not leave the courtroom before the conclusion of the hearing or until a recess has been announced by the court;
- After the phrase, “Do the parties have any questions regarding the text of the ruling?”, please do not address questions to the judges. Court hearings are not press conferences, and under the Code of Judicial Ethics, judges are not permitted to comment on their decisions.
